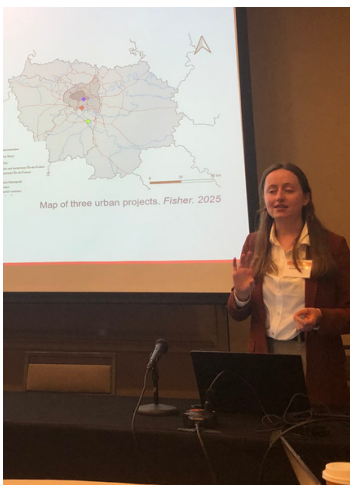

Public-private dialogue on logistics research DGITM, 10 July 2025

The 1st edition of a dialogue organized by the French Ministry of Transportation included debates and exchanges between sectors that still collaborate too little. In particular, it provided an opportunity to discuss the impact of international crises on logistics, and the scale and challenges of logistics in the context of the necessary ecological transition. Finally, it served as a reminder of how important it is for researchers working in both the North and South to have access to data that is still too rarely shared by economic actors.

Seminar on public policies on urban logistics 5th november 2025

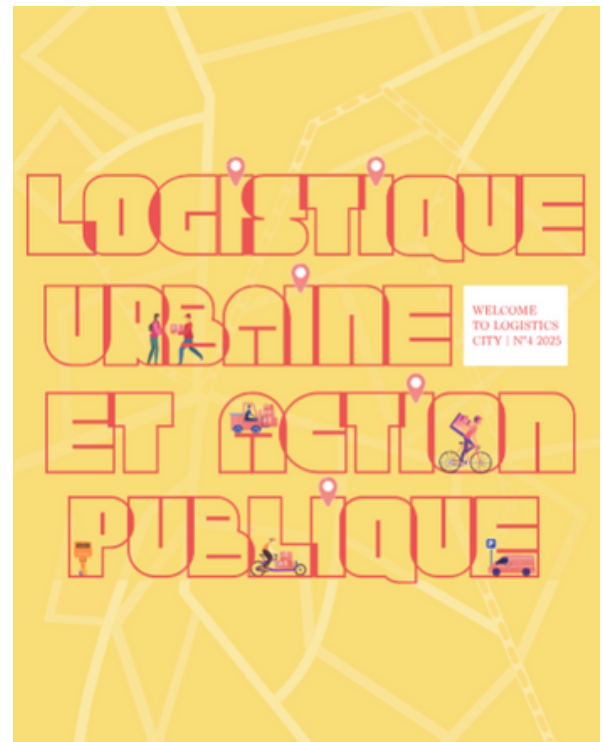
The 5th November 2025 at the Maison des Ponts in the 16th arrondissement of Paris : a day of meetings between local public stakeholders and academics will be organized

Welcome to Logistics City #4, 2025

The Chair's booklet No. 4, co-authored by François Adoue, Laetitia Dabanc and Juliette Berthon, looks at various topics linked to urban logistics policies: low emission zones, zero net land take, fast deliveries, new data sources, and their impact on urban logistics.

It will soon be printed and available on the Chair's website.

The booklet includes five chapters:

- Governing urban logistics
- Banning polluting vehicles in cities: comparing Low Emission Zones in the regulation of urban logistics in Europe
- Logistics spatial planning and zoning
- Curb management and logistics
- Better data to govern urban logistics

A small novelty for this fourth edition of the Chair's booklet (to be published): an 8-page executive summary has been produced by Marie Baléo for wider access to results.

International seminar & Survey on gig delivery workers

International seminar 29-30 January 2026

The Chair will organize a seminar around research results, in particular quantitative surveys carried out among gig delivery workers, in a hybrid format: a face-to-face part in Paris for speakers who can travel, and a remote part in the form of two webinars for speakers from Asia, Africa and the Americas.

Launched as part of the **ERROLI** project funded by the French Road Safety Delegation, with additional funding from the City of Paris, this new phase of **the survey aims to update data on the profiles and practices of gig delivery workers, and to gain a better understanding of road accidents involving gig delivery drivers on bicycles and mopeds.**

A first phase of surveys in Paris and Lyon will be launched in the Fall of 2025 and a second one in 2026.
